 - Inadequate safety devices
 - Presence of lead-based paint
 - Unsafe appliances/ equipment

Knowledge

Consider:

- client's level of awareness of basic home safety
- client's knowledge of housing resources

Behavior

Consider:

- clients willingness to make the home safe
- seeking adequate housing

Status

Consider:

- overall safety status of home related to risk of injury
 - degree of severity of S&S/hazards from Home Safety Check List
