TGC	Anatomy/Physiology	Other Teach client and/or primary caregiver GU system function
TGC	Bladder Care	Other Catheter Care Teach client and/or primary caregiver how and why: 1) Empty drainage bag according to schedule 2) Properly position drainage bag 3) Avoid kinks, loops or tension on tubing 4) Change leg bag to bedside bag 5) Proper cleaning & storage of bags
TGC	Dietary Management	Other Drinking adequate amounts of fluid
TGC	Signs/Symptoms-Physical	When to Notify Providers Teach client and/or primary caregiver to notify RN when: 1) Signs of catheter malfunction are present 2) Urine leakage around catheter, no drainage in bag, painful perineal area 3) Signs and symptoms of infection are present: fever, chills, blood in urine, bladder spasms, concentrated urine
TP	Bladder Care	Other Catheter Insertion/Change RN to perform catheter insertion and periodic change according to policy and procedure/MD orders
TP	Specimen Collection	Other Obtain sterile specimen as ordered
CM	Supplies	Other Catheter Supplies RN to help coordinate provision of 1) Catheter kit 2) Leg and bedside bags 3) Catheter straps
S	Signs/Symptoms-Physical	Other Urologic Status Assess and report to MD evidence of infection
